



ALICE REVISITED
 A new light on a classic tale

This summer sees the 150th anniversary of *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland*, and Lewis Carroll's 1865 children's novel inspires two very different new books. In *The Story of Alice* (Harvill Secker, April), Robert Douglas-Fairhurst traces the lives of Carroll (Charles Dodgson) and his inspiration, Alice Liddell. In her debut novel, *The Looking-Glass House* (Corvus, July), Vanessa Tait, Alice's great-granddaughter, retells the story of Dodgson's interest in the Liddell children from their governess' perspective. Both authors appear in a new BBC Two documentary featuring Philip Pullman, whose foreword graces *The Complete Alice*, published by Macmillan (July). There's also a special Vintage Children's Classics edition of *Alice's Adventures in Wonderland* designed in collaboration with Vivienne Westwood.
